THURSDAY: BERLIN AIRLIFT

FRANK KNOLLE IS AMONG those young American and British pilot-heroes who flew 6000 TONS a *day* to supply Berlin from June 1948 through September 1949, flying a total distance of the earth to the sun, carrying coffee and coal, meat and milk, salt and meat, everything to sustain millions of Berliners. Frank and his friends were flying 24 hours a day, piloting propeller-driven C-47s (the classic DC-3) and later C-54s, from the Soviet's sudden "repair work" that closed Western access to Berlin. Our good member tells us more this week, bringing his flight suit that still fits his trim fly-boy figure.
