

JOHN H. CLAY
Governor, District 530, 1966-1967

John Clay was inducted into the Rotary Club of San Marino in May of 1946 during the presidency of Percy Cowherd. John was asked to fill the unexpired term of Paul Hanson as Director and was the Editor of the Roto-Scope, 1947-1948. The Club elected John president for the Rotary year commencing July 1, 1949. He and his Rotaryanne, Edna, son John, and daughter Julia attended the Rotary International Convention in New York City in June 1949.

In addition to serving on several District Committees, John served as the Governor's representative for Governor Art Withrow and also later for Governor Carl Hoelscher.

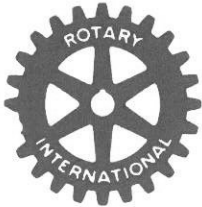
John was born in Glendale, California, and he attended schools in Los Angeles and graduated from Los Angeles City College. He also attended Southwestern University Law School and the University of Southern California and is a member of the University Club in Pasadena. He was employed as an x-ray technician with the Los Angeles County Health Department, where he met Kansas University graduate, Edna, a bacteriologist.

John served as a Scout master, an Explorer Scout leader and assisted with the Girl Scout program. He served 11 years on the Alhambra City and High School Board of Education, three of which were as President of the Board of Education. As a member of the Alhambra First Methodist Church, John serves as Vice President on the Alhambra Methodist Church Foundation.

The Nominating Committee of District 530 was unanimous in naming John as the nominee for Governor for District 530 for 1966-1967 and he was formally elected at the Convention in Denver, Colorado in June 1966.

His Hi Neighbor Conference in Las Vegas was hosted by the Rotary Club of Alhambra and the Rotary Club of San Marino was very active in support of their Second District Governor. The Group Study Exchange between District 530 and District 245 of Western Australia added additional interest to the District Conference. The Group Study team was in attendance and participated in the program. President Don Scott recalls that it was an exciting and rewarding year for San Marino Rotarians and Rotaryannes.

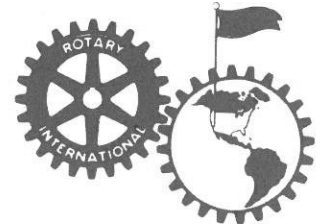
