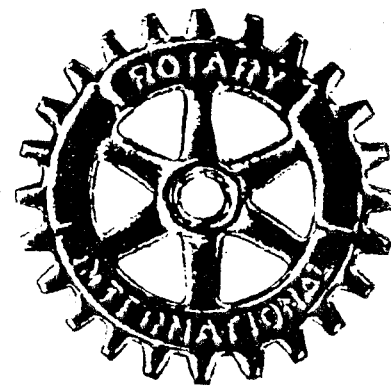

BRIEF HISTORY OF SAN MARINO ROTARY AS OF ITS 50th ANNIVERSARY

Beginnings

Organization Meeting--Feb. 3, 1939--with 6 Alhambra Rotarians and 12 San Marino business and professional men.

2nd Meeting--Feb. 10, 1939--Day (Thursday), time (12:10) and place (Huntington Hotel) set; officers and directors selected. Jim Barton elected president, who appointed Elmer Neher vice president, Martin Scott secretary, Larry Shepard Treasurer and John Hoffman by-laws chairman.

Charter Membership Closed--Feb. 16, 1939--with 24 members.

R. I. notified San Marino it would be Club No. 5010 in District 107, with attendance records starting Apr. 13, 1939.

1st Year Highlights--Started sponsoring Boy Scout troop, "181st Lacy Park", initiated Rotoscore, and IOQV meeting place to Pierre's Restaurant, S. M.

Main Projects and Achievements

"Story of Rotary", by Edd No. WOOD--1942--Became best-seller among all U.S. Clubs.

Youth in Gov't--1945--Sent copy to Sacramento for California Boy's State Day.

Vocational Service Award at District Conference--1948--(now # 160).

Rancho Los Amigos--1950--Took first-class IOQVies weekly to polio patients.

Ninoshima Orphanage--1953--Sent financial assistance (Hiroshima Bay, Japan).

Fair Play Awards started--1953--to 6 High School seniors (3 boys and 3 girls).

American Field Service Exchange Students program Participation--1954.

Magazines for Friendship--1960--Shipped abroad to depict American Way of Life.

Club Banner Created--1962--white, with Blue Boyan it.

Interact Club--1963--first in District (now #530).

YMCA cabin at Big Bear camp (supplied labor and materials)--1964--25th Anniversary.

Raffles begun to raise money for Foundation--1965

District 530 award for Best Interact Club--1966.

Pledged \$3000 for Rotary Room at the San Marino-South Pasadena "Y"--1966.

Rotary Park established--1967--with help of our Interact students.

Started operating Game Booths for High School Grad Night--1973.

"Operation Shadow" room--1978 (renamed "Career Connection" in 1988).

"Run for Fun" began--1979--with 300 entrants.

Started sending graduate students from San Marino abroad as Rotary Fellows--1979.

Celebrated R. I.'s 75th Anniversary--1980--with dinner-dance at Huntington Hotel.

Began sending kindergarten supplies to Guatemala--1980.

San Marino Dialysis Room funded--1981--in Harold Wagner Lodge at y's Camp Whittle.

Took in our 100th member--1982.

Best Club in District award--1982 and 1983.

Polio Eradication Program (PEP) started--1984.

High School "Student of the Month" initiated--1985.

Ranked 6th Rotary Club in the world for Foundation support--1986.

Polio Plus program quota met in one year--1987-88.

\$50,000 contributed to Foundation, commemorating our 50th Anniversary--1989.

John H. Clay, District Governor of District 530 for 1966-67 (after being Governor's Zone Representative in 1957 and 1961).

Frank Weirick, Arch Klump Award from R. I. in 1970 (for Foundation work).

Roy Denny, Ambassador-at-Large for District; (160-C)--1954 (first 1st V.P. of R.I.)

Bill Knoke, "Rotary Foundation Citation for Meritorious Service" in 1976 and R.I. is "Distinguished Service Award" in 1981.
